Airport Information

Bluegrass Airport drive time to University of Kentucky campus is approximately 20 minutes.

Ground Transportation to/from Airport

Directions for Driving to University of Kentucky College of Dentistry

From Elizabethtown, Lawrenceburg and Versailles via Bluegrass Parkway

- Take Bluegrass Parkway to Lexington and exit right onto US 60 East at Exit 72A.
- Follow Versailles Road/US 60 East for several miles. You will pass Keeneland Race Track and Bluegrass Airport.
- Pass under New Circle Road (KY 4).
- Several blocks after passing Cardinal Hill Rehab Hospital, you will see a Lee's Chicken restaurant. Turn right at this intersection onto Red Mile Road.
- Follow Red Mile Road past the Red Mile Race Track until you come to the intersection at South Broadway. Go straight through the intersection, and Red Mile Road becomes Virginia Avenue.
- Turn Right onto South Limestone. Follow signs to Hospital Parking Garage.

From Louisville via I-64

- Follow I-64 East toward Lexington and take exit 115, turning right onto Newtown Pike/KY 922 toward Lexington.
- Cross over New Circle Road (KY 4) and continue on Newtown Pike/KY 922 until you reach Main Street.
- Turn left onto West Main Street (US 25/421) toward downtown Lexington. At the Civic Center, stay right and proceed down Vine Street.
- Turn right onto South Broadway.
- Continue on south Broadway and turn left onto Virginia Avenue.
- Turn right onto South Limestone. Follow signs to Hospital Parking Garage.

From Northern Kentucky and Cincinnati via I-75

- Follow I-75 South toward Lexington.
- Take exit 113 (marked Paris/Lexington).

- Turn right onto North Broadway (Route 68 West/27 South). You will pass Applebee's Baseball Stadium.
- Follow North Broadway toward downtown Lexington. You will drive under a flashing light at Transylvania University. North Broadway becomes South Broadway after crossing Main Street.
- Continue on South Broadway past the Radisson and Hyatt Hotels. After a mile, move into the left hand lane.
- Turn left onto Virginia Avenue at the traffic light just past the Shell gas station.
- Turn right onto South Limestone. Follow signs to Hospital Parking Garage.

From Richmond and Berea via I-75

- Follow I-75 North to Lexington.
- Take Exit 104 to KY 418 (marked Lexington/Athens).
- Turn left off the exit onto KY 418 toward Lexington. KY 418 becomes Richmond Road/US 25 near Jacobson Park.
- Follow Richmond Road/US 25 for 4 miles, and cross Man o' War Blvd.
- Continue on Richmond Road/US 25 toward downtown Lexington, crossing New Circle Road (KY 4)
- Continue toward downtown on Richmond Road/US 25. You will pass Shriner's Hospital.
- As you come into downtown, Richmond Road becomes Main Street. Follow Main Street, passing Thoroughbred Park on your right.
- Move into the left lane of Main Street and turn left onto South Broadway.
- Continue on South Broadway and turn left onto Virginia Avenue.
- Turn right onto south Limestone. Follow signs to Hospital Parking Garage.

DENTAL FACILITY AND SERVICES

Building and Access Hours

The Dental Science Wing will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. during the Western Regional Board Examination, unless otherwise requested by the examiners.

Parking

Parking in and around the vicinity of the university is controlled by university parking services. If you park in any lot without a valid permit, you risk being ticketed or towed. Most employee lots and student commuter lots are accessible and available on weekends. Permits are not required after 3:30 p.m. Friday afternoons until 5:00 a.m. Monday mornings. Exam Patients

Due to a limited number of available patients, **University of Kentucky College of Dentistry is not able to provide candidates with patients.** We will do whatever we can to help you during your visit; however, we must strongly encourage you to make sure that you have your patients selected ahead of time. Patient brokering, i.e. the selling of patients, will **not** be tolerated under any circumstances within the College of

Dentistry and/or on the premises of the university. Violation of this rule will result in immediate removal from the campus of the university.

Patient Screening

The school does not have patients available for candidates to screen. Candidates who solicit patients for the city may bring patients to the dental school for examination and/or radiographs on **March 22 – 24 from 10:00 until Noon and from 2:30 – 4:30**. You must check in with Adrena Woolwine D 232, on the 2nd floor, before seeing your patients.

DENTAL SCHOOL RADIOGRAPH POLICY

School Radiographic facilities

1. Facilities for **Operative and Periodontal Exams**-This site will provide both Conventional Radiographic Facilities and Digital Facilities. Digital support will be as follows:

Printed Digital

Facilities for the **Endodontic Exam**- This site will provide **Conventional Facilities Only**

This exam site **is not equipped** for secure transmission of images between different exam sites or sites from another dental school to the exam site.

- It is recommended that candidates have conventional or printed radiographs taken before arriving at the University of Kentucky, if possible.
- If candidates need to make digital or conventional radiographs of their board patients, there will be a usage fee of \$30 per patient and patients will need to register in the College of Dentistry. Please call Adrena Woolwine (859) 323-5876 for more information about the registration process.
- The University of Kentucky uses digital radiography acquired with sensors (Schick®) only. **Radiology will be available for screening of potential patients on March 22 – 24. During the hours stated above.**
- Radiology **will not** be available for **screening patients** during the Board exam.
- All digital images taken at this site will be provided in **print** form only.

Equipment, Instruments and Materials

Our dental units are equipped to hook up to a 3 or 4-hole handpiece. Each unit is equipped with a high-speed intraoral light and operator stool. Most units are also equipped with a composite curing light. There are some additional curing lights available for check out at the dispensary window on the exam floor. In order to check out these and insure that they are returned for use the following day we will require a valid drivers license to hold until it is returned. You may prefer to bring your own as an alternative. Ultrasonic units have a "quick disconnect" located on the dental chair. All operatories can be converted to left-handed operators.

The candidate may rent all equipment, instruments and handpieces needed for the Examination. Instrument rental fees will be **\$200.00**. This fee is non-refundable. A check in the amount of the replacement cost of the instruments/ equipment rented will be held by the College until the examination is completed and all instruments have been accounted for. At this time the check will be returned to the candidate.

Fees for the rental of handpieces only (non-refundable) will be **\$70.00**. A check in the amount of the replacement cost of the handpieces will be held by the College until the examination is completed and the hand pieces are accounted for. This check will then be returned to the candidate.

Contact Adrena Woolwine (Room D232) when you arrive at the College if you wish to rent equipment. She will escort you to the Administrative Office to pay the \$200.00 or \$70.00 fee. The check for the replacement cost of instruments is taken and held at the window of the Dispensary on the 2nd floor when you receive the instruments.

Ultrasonic scalers are not available. Candidates should bring their own ultrasonic scaler to the examination.

MODUPRO Dentoforms/typodonts will **not** be available on site. It is the candidate's responsibility to secure the ModuPRO upper and lower jaw model. To order the typodont contact:

Candidates are encouraged to bring any materials they feel comfortable working with since the College may use materials that are unfamiliar to some candidates. There is one automatic developer on the 2nd floor. There will be a daylight processors and dip tank available in the designated endodontic examination area.

Dental Laboratory Facilities

There is a laboratory adjacent to the clinical examination area, on 2nd and 3rd floor, D230 and D330, which is available for wet lab work on Friday and Saturday night. There is a casting lab located on 6th floor, D 603. It has two casting wells, burnout ovens, vacuum former and model trimmers. There are no torches, rings and liners available. You must bring your own.

Infection Control.

Pre-moistened germicide and prophene spray wipes will be available in each bay for candidates to disinfect their cubicle. Protective barriers for bracket tables, chairbacks and light handles will be available. The candidate will remove all debris, paper, etc. from the cubicle. Please place all sharps in the red sharps containers located in the cubicles.

Candidates are to wear appropriate Personal Protective Equipment at all times while setting up, disinfecting operatories and treating patients. Please bring your own protective eyewear. Reusable gowns will be provided and are located in the back of the treatment areas. When finished with your patient and after disinfecting your cubicle place soiled gowns in the soiled containers in the back of the clinic. If you would prefer disposable gowns please bring these with you to the exam. Gloves and masks will be provided for you.

At the end of patient treatment and prior to seating additional patients:

1. Remove all protective barriers from operatory and dispose.
2. Remove high-speed and slow-speed handpiece lines, curing light and operator side air-water syringe from unit and place on the foot of the chair so that no handpiece lubricant will flow out of lines. Leave suction and air water syringe on the assistant side in holders.
3. Replace protective barriers
 - a. on chair
 - b. on instrument tray unit (cover everything)
 - c. on light handles
4. Clean/Disinfect all uncovered touched areas including operator stool and assistant stool.
5. Clean/Disinfect high-speed and slow-speed handpiece lines, curing light and air-water syringe and replace in holders on top of the plastic barriers.
6. Clean/Disinfect lines on assistant side of chair.
7. Clean/Disinfect cabinet countertops, x-ray view box, amalgamator and sink.

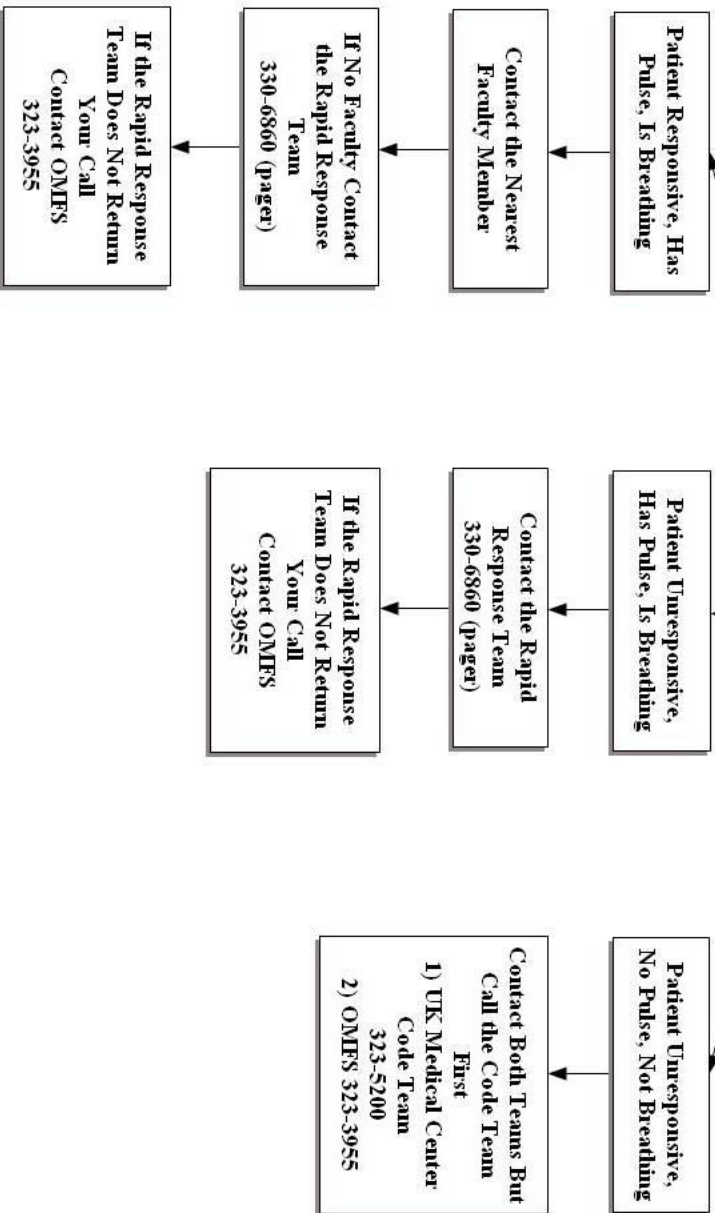
At the end of the day:

1. Remove protective barriers and dispose.
2. Remove high-speed and slow speed handpiece lines, curing light and air-water syringe lines from the unit and place on the foot of the chair so that no handpiece lubricant will flow out of the lines.
3. Place assistant chair in the corner.
4. Straighten tray table over chair and center the light over the tray table.

Note: Be sure to seat the high-speed handpiece line **firmly in the holder** after the unit has been disinfected so the fiber optic light will not come on when the unit is turned on.

Prophene spray is available for disinfection when needed.

When you page the Rapid Response Team leave your phone number, then hang up the phone and WAIT for their return call. When they call provide any information they require, follow any instructions they provide, remember to remain on the phone until the other party hangs up and make sure someone is present in the College of Dentistry first floor lobby and in the lobby of the floor where the emergency occurred to meet the Rapid Response Team and direct them to the proper location.

When you call the Hospital Code Team or the OMIES Team be prepared to give the following information: A) your name and phone number, B) location of the emergency, C) nature of the emergency if known (ex: allergic reaction, heart attack, etc.), D) patient condition: are they breathing, are they responsive, do they have a pulse, E) remember to remain on the phone until the other party hangs up and make sure someone is present in the College of Dentistry first floor lobby and in the lobby of the floor where the emergency occurred to meet the Team or Teams responding to the emergency and direct them to the proper location.
