WREB Exams at Eastern Washington University (EWU) Riverpoint Campus

Patient Procurement and Screening: Candidates must provide their own patient. EWU will not furnish any patients or make any records available for patient screening prior to the exam. Eastern Washington University will not provide clinical space for patient screening.

Note: A practitioner(s) from the school is not available to administer local anesthesia to candidates' patients. There are no exceptions to this policy.

The Clinic: EWU clinics are equipped with ADEC chairs and workstations. Two varieties of handpiece hoses are available on each unit: a 4-hole standard ADEC high speed handpiece hose and a 4-hole Midwest Quick-Connect hose (for slow speed) with built-in swivel. **EWU will provide a high speed handpiece and a slow speed handpiece with a latch head at each unit for the restorative exam. Both handpieces are made by Star Dentaleze.**

Blood pressure cuffs: are located at each unit. However, you will need to bring your own stethoscope.

Ultrasonic Inserts: Each unit is equipped with a 30 MHz ultrasonic Dentsply Cavitron unit and a Dentsply SteriMate handpiece. Candidates must provide their own 30 MHz ultrasonic inserts.

X-rays: exposure and developing are \$2.50 per film (up to a maximum of \$25.00) We can accommodate printed digital x-rays and conventional x-rays, we will not print any digital x-rays on exam days.

Curing lights: are available at each unit during the Restorative Exam.

Metal, Adec air/water syringe tips: will be provided, **one per unit**. If you need more than one syringe tip they will be available for purchase. You may either bring an Adec air/water syringe tip with you or be prepared to purchase one at EWU for your exam. Adec recommends metal tips for safety reasons. This cost is \$5.88 including tax. Only exact cash or checks are accepted.

Parking: is available, adjacent to the east side of the building, with a permit for \$3.26 per day. Permits may be purchased at the end of the clinic tour from the site staff. Only exact cash or checks are accepted.

Please note: *If you stay in one of the hotels across the street from the exam site, you may leave your vehicle in the hotel parking lot free of charge.*

NOTE: Please be sure to tell the shuttle driver that your exam is at EWU's Riverpoint campus, not in Cheney.

INFECTION CONTROL PROCEDURES FOR SITE:

Location of expendable materials will vary for each type of exam. During the clinic tour, you will be directed to the location(s) of all supplies provided at this site.

Instructions on setting up units.

After cleaning and disinfecting the surfaces, wash your hands with antimicrobial soap. Gather all the barriers you need and begin setting up your treatment area. You may choose to wear exam gloves for this, however, clean hands contacting previously cleaned and disinfected items is acceptable.

Place a **headrest cover** over the chair headrest and a plastic barrier over the **disinfected cart top**. Plastic bags will be placed over both hose hanger bars. It is important to place the plastic correctly so that the hangers are totally protected from contact with the hoses and handpieces.

Place narrow plastic sacks over the **evacuation handpiece(s)** and **air/water syringe handpiece**. Place a disposable saliva ejector tip in holder if you expect to use it. Later when you open your sterile instrument packs, place the HVE tip with screen and air water tip in appropriate places.

Cover **light switch, light handles, pens and pencils** with appropriate barriers. Tape a paper bag to side of cabinet.

Place a section of plastic on the damp, disinfected **counters** near your chair. Have the plastic drape down the front of counter. You may tape your overgloves (and instrument sharpening guide to this barrier). Your other disposable supplies, pens and pencils may be placed on this barrier.

Cover the **instrument tray** with a plastic bag, place tray cover on top, add a few 2 x 2 gauze squares, disposable dappen dishes (for lip balm or topical), cotton applicator sticks, etc. as you choose.

Location of sharps disposal containers.

Red sharps containers will be conveniently located on countertops throughout the examination area.

CLINICAL TREATMENT AREA PROCEDURE – END OF EXAM:

- a. Remember to wear your gloves, safety eyewear, and masks for all clean up activities.
- b. Remove **contaminated surface covers** without contaminating the previously disinfected surfaces. Begin with the large plastic cover on the cart. Place the other covers, exam gloves, cart-side brown bag, bibs and other disposables on it and tie up the four corners to make a small pouch. It should then be disposed of in the large covered garbage containers. The uncovered garbage containers under sinks are used for paper towel disposal only.
- c. Contaminated needles and used anesthetic cartridges are regulated waste and are placed in the Sharps Containers. DO NOT place LA protector cards in the sharps container; these can go into the trash.

Location of oxygen and other emergency equipment:

1. Portable oxygen tanks are located at the east end (away from windows) of islands 1, 2 and 3 in the clinic. Each oxygen set up contains bag, valve, mask, nasal canula and pocket mask. (Locations marked with **O₂** on floor plan.)
2. Emergency drug kits are above and just to the left of the sinks at Islands 1, 2, and 3, and are clearly marked. Perio-retrievers are available in the drug kits located in Islands 1 and 2. (Locations marked with **Rx** on floor plan.)

3. BP cuffs only are mounted on wall by each treatment area; a stethoscope and large cuff is available with each emergency drug kit. Chemical ice packs also available at that location and in the expendable material location.
4. Phone is located on the west wall adjacent to operatory #20. (Location marked with **Pn** on floor plan.)
5. To reach 9-1-1, simply dial 911. No prefix is required; however, it does take a few seconds for it to ring through so just hold on. To reach campus security dial 5-358-7995, or #40 from any campus phone.
6. An AED is located on the wall between the two restrooms across from chair #3.

LIMITED STERILIZATION will be available.

Candidates should arrive with all items needed previously sterilized. In cases where an item is dropped or other wise contaminated a StatIM steam sterilizer is available.

Procedure for Sterilization:

Sterilization bags are available near the sterilization room. Record your candidate number in pencil on the outside, notify the clinical assistant that you need the instruments sterilized and how quickly you need them, and place the bag on the cart outside room 176. The bags will be run through the StatIM and returned to you in the client/candidate reception area. See exam dental assistants for additional assistance.

BASIC EMERGENCY AND SAFETY INFORMATION

Phones:

- There is one phone in the clinic and is located up at the front end of the clinic.
- For emergency help dial **9-1-1**, to reach campus security dial **#40 from any campus phone or 5-358-7995**

Fire Extinguishers:

- 3 total fire extinguishers--one located across from chairs 3 and 33, as well as next to the conference room
- How to use: pull the pin, aim at the base of the fire, and squeeze the trigger.
- **Do not use if faced with a large or rapidly growing fire, just exit as soon as possible (always take your patient with you).**
- Fire Blankets are located at islands 1, 2, and 3 in the cupboards with the emergency drug kits.

Nearest Exits:

- Main side doors to the clinic, near chair 3.
- From the building, straight out to the east of the building (left of the elevators).
- **Meet in the center of the cement walkway to other building**

Eyewash Stations (please insure that both you and your patient wear protective eyewear):

- Eyewash stations are located at islands 1, 2, and 3, room 179 (darkroom) and room 176 (sterilization room)

Emergency Oxygen:

- 3--Victor Oxygen Therapy Regulators attached to oxygen tanks in portable carts (next to chairs 2, 9 and 31). Each tank has an adult and child Ambu bag, nasal canula and oxygen mask.

First Aid and Emergency Kits:

- Emergency kits are located at islands 1, 2, and 3 in the cupboards above and to the left of the sinks.
- Cold packs are located next to each of the emergency kits and at the expendable material location.

AED:

- Located on the wall between the two restrooms across from chair #3.

MSDS Manuals/Books:

- Located on desk near computer terminal opposite chair 20.

Exposures and Exposure Personnel (wear your PPE and handle sharps carefully):

- See Clinic/Site Supervisor or clinical assistants in clinic during the exam for paperwork.
