2010 Brings New Efficiency Enhancements to Operations at WREB

WREB staff has worked diligently throughout the summer and fall months to be ready for the 2010 exam season. Staff continues to study their jobs and find ways to make internal processes more efficient so that we can make the entire process friendlier for our candidates and state boards awaiting results.

In 2010 efficiency improvements include: the ability for dental candidates taking only one section of an exam to register on-line for the section they need to repeat, the ability for EFDA candidates from the State of Washington to register for exams on line and the ability to report results electronically to State Boards after exams are complete. In addition, all results will be delivered electronically to candidates' secure WREB mailbox, reducing results turnaround time by 3-5 days in most cases. In addition, candidate tutorials are available online for all candidates as well as school information. WREB also has expanded capabilities to conduct online meetings, reducing travel costs and committee member stress and fatigue related to travel.

On the examiner side, all examiners will create a personal log-in and the pre-exam tutorials will be available on line. Hygiene examiners are also taking advantage of pre-exam online training for HESS.

All of these improvements benefit both the staff and those we serve.



HESS Rolled Out at Spring Dental Hygiene Exams!

The Hygiene Electronic Scoring System is scheduled to be rolled out at the first hygiene exams in spring 2010. Work began on this enhancement to the process of collecting scoring data in fall 2008. Its implementation is the culmination of hours of effort and collaboration between the HESS work group members, the Dental Hygiene Committee, staff and WREB's IT partner Kinetik IT.

Huge thanks go out to all who participated in the process of developing the software and working through the many details involved in beta testing and rollout. Special recognition goes to Kelly Reich, Robin Krych, Nic Cronin and Rad Masinelli, who made huge contributions.

Essentially, HESS replaces all of the paperwork that examiners use to record data. The only paper that remains in the system is the paperwork that is used to communicate between examiners and candidates.

Prior to arriving at exams this season, all examiners will have received training for the new system online. In addition to the pre-exam training, the HESS system is used to conduct calibration and also to provide refresher training. Examiners have found it to be very simple and user friendly and a real enhancement to the process.

David S. Low Service Award 2010

Dr. James Sparks has been named as the recipient of the David S. Low Service Award for 2010. The Executive Committee annually selects either a dentist or a hygienist, on a rotating basis from among the WREB examiners who exemplify the many outstanding qualities exhibited by Dr. Low over his years of service to WREB. Dr. James Sparks is to receive his award at the July meeting of the Board of Directors from Dr. Bruce Horn, WREB's president.



Dr. Mark Christensen Receives AADB "Citizen of the Year Award"

The AADB 2010 Citizen of the Year Award is awarded at the Annual Meeting of the American Association of Dental Examiners. This honor is based on nominations submitted by the membership and is based on several factors:



- Must be a member of the AADB
- Service to the AADB such as membership, attendance, committees or leadership positions
- Regional and/or State Board committees and leadership positions
- Participation in state, regional or national programs
- Experience in the examination process – development and/or implementation
- Participation in other professional organizations (such as ADA, ASDA, ADHA or similar)
- Community service

Dr. Christensen has been an active WREB examiner since 1985, and served as president of WREB in 1991. Mark continues his contribution to WREB on strategic planning committees and numerous test construction subcommittees. His professional leadership in all of his endeavors make this a well deserved award. Congratulations to Mark!

Massachusetts Board Reverses Denial of WREB Results

In 2009 the Massachusetts Board of Registration in Dentistry denied licensure to several applicants who had successfully passed the WREB dental exam. The Massachusetts Board was defining success by achieving a score of 75% on each section of the exam. WREB scores are based on a sliding scale of 1-5. A rating of 3.0 or higher is considered passing by WREB. Although WREB states that a rating of 3.0 is the equivalent of a 75% score on a percentage exam, the Massachusetts Board was recalculating the WREB ratings on a linear percentage system and was denying licensure to applicants who scored less than 3.75 (75% of 5) on any section of the exam.

Extensive discussion with Massachusetts explained that the WREB scoring scale is not linear and the criteria is based on a rating of "3" being minimum competency, which is the same criteria whether recorded as "3," "75%" or "Pass." A rating of 3.75 on the WREB exam is significantly above minimum competency. Dr. Mark Christensen made a presentation to the Massachusetts Board explaining the rationale for the WREB scoring system. He also presented psychometric guidelines that indicate boards should accept the scoring system as designed by the testing service. Due to Dr. Christensen's clear presentation, along with support from an attorney hired by the applicants who were denied licensure; WREB prevailed and the Massachusetts Board reversed their decision, and now accepts the WREB scores as designed. This was a huge success for WREB and for the candidates who have shown their competency on the WREB exam.

WREB spends considerable time and expertise in developing criteria and scoring rubrics. All of this information is carefully researched, field tested, and supported by literature before implementation. State Boards should feel completely confident that the WREB exam follows the published guidelines for test development and provides a fair, reliable evaluation of the candidate's competency.

2010 Dental Educator Forum held in Phoenix

The annual meeting with dental educators to inform them of changes to the WREB exam for the coming year, was held in Phoenix, at the WREB office on January 8, 2010. The meeting was well attended with approximately 20 educators present. Dr. Charles Broadbent facilitated the meeting.

This was the first year that the event was held in the WREB office. Since moving into the new space, there is a sufficient room

in the office to accommodate meetings of this size and type. With everyone able to gather around a large conference table, there was much give and take between WREB staff and the educational community, rather than a typical presentation format. This forum was well received on both sides.

WREB plans to hold future meetings in the Phoenix office as well, due to such positive feedback from educators.

2010 Dental Hygiene Educator Forums

WREB remains committed to maintaining open communication with educators and providing information concerning the exams. As a mechanism for communication with dental hygiene educators, WREB hosted two Restorative Educator Forums in January. Portland Community College in Portland, OR and Seattle Central Community College in Seattle, WA were the host sites. WREB felt the forum would be a helpful tool to newer programs and those programs that teach Expanded Function Dental Auxiliaries (EFDA) candidates in Washington and Oregon. The forum provided an overview of the Restorative examination, with emphasis on criteria and exam changes for 2010.

The Restorative Forums consisted of an overview of the exam, as well as specific information concerning exam criteria and procedures. WREB representatives discussed the application process, faculty observer guidelines, and WREB's Policy Guide. As they discussed each area of the clinical exam, they pointed out any changes that were made to improve the exam and/or clarify information to candidates and examiners. Examiner preparation

and procedures, with emphasis on standardization and calibration exercises was also discussed. There was unanimous support for the exam and educators were extremely impressed with it.

On February 5, WREB hosted another Educator Forum in Phoenix, AZ. This forum focused solely on WREB's computer-based exam, now known as the Process of Care Exam, which will be implemented in 2011. The Process of Care Exam is intended to enhance the current clinical examination by further testing candidate's decision making skills throughout all phases of dental hygiene care; through the health history assessment, care planning, disease classification, prognosis, patient evaluation, and outcomes phases of dental hygiene. The exam is designed as a conjunctive test (candidates must successfully pass both the computer examination and the clinical examination to successfully pass the WREB Dental Hygiene exam).

WREB always welcomes educator input and appreciates all that educators do in preparing their students for the exam process.

Compliance Review by Dr. Thomas M. Haladyna

Dr. Thomas M. Haladyna, Professor Emeritus, Arizona State University, commenced an independent review of WREB's dental and dental hygiene testing programs. In compliance with testing standards WREB commissions an outside review every 5-10 years. The last review was completed in 2005. The purpose of an outside review is to provide a summative judgement about the quality of the examination, based on validity evidence. Such reports provide state boards the documentation necessary to validate the use of a specific exam.

Dr. Haladyna will review the WREB exams to determine compliance with testing standards, based on Standards for Educational and Psychological Testing, developed by the

American Educational Research Association, the American Psychological Association, and the National Council on Measurement in Education.

His review will include critical analysis of test results, meeting notes, evidential documentation, all policies and procedures as well as appropriate testing documents.

Dr. Haladyna is a nationally recognized expert in testing and has published widely. He has served as a consultant to numerous organizations, including the American Dental Association. WREB is fortunate to have such a highly acclaimed specialist available to us.
